A PERSONAL TESTIMONY: MY "GOD MOMENT" - by Brenda Wisz

May brings Mother's Day, and you are truly blessed if you have a good relationship with the woman you call "Mom." For some of us, however, the day can be challenging if we are dealing with issues from a less-than-perfect relationship with our mother; I was in that latter group for many years.

I butted heads with Mom from day one. We have very different personalities, and although I'm sure she loved me, she never told me. We definitely didn't "like" each other and had numerous hurtful verbal exchanges over time.

Even when I left home at 18, things didn't improve. Our visits often ended with strained goodbyes, with the implication she was glad I was leaving. I dutifully called her once a week (she NEVER called me) but our dialogue was guarded & superficial. When I came to Christ, I prayed she would also. My motive was selfish because I hoped she would then change & be easier to deal with; her salvation was secondary.

Twenty four years ago we had a major confrontation, leaving me in tears. My father was very ill, and I told Mike that when he died I was DONE with Mom, that I wasn't going to put up with her for another 20 years. But God had other plans, and through His grace gave me inner strength to stay in the relationship, and to keep our conflicts to a minimum.

Three years ago Mom fell & broke her wrist while we were visiting. My sister & I waited with her in the hospital exam room and Mom was terrified. Suddenly the room became very white, and still, as if time had stopped. In that instant God showed me Mom as HE saw her – an insecure, frightened, elderly woman who felt vulnerable and alone – AND that He loved her with great compassion. Neither Mom nor Sue spoke of seeing anything unusual, but I knew I had been given a special gift, a "God moment," and my heart was changed. Mike & I stayed an extra week to help Mom, & on the way home Mike said, "Bren, I've NEVER seen you so sacrificial with your Mom." And I told him what I had seen.

For the last three years, Mom & I have come to actually enjoy each other – to play cards, paint birdhouses, bake cookies together. She's no longer on guard or defensive when we talk; SHE even calls ME and our phone conversations can run 2 - 2 1/2 hours several times a week. She looks forward to our visits, and cries when we leave, hugs the breath out of me, and tells me she loves me! PRAISE GOD!

I still pray for our relationship every day, but now it is because I treasure it and want to guard it against Satan who desires to destroy what God has created. I still pray for her to know Jesus, but now it is so I can have her with me for eternity!

Scripture tells us that God sent Jesus "at just the right time" (Romans 5:5); I believe God graced me with this heavenly vision at "just the right time," too, when my heart was open and my faith mature enough to see this event for what it was: a miracle designed just for Mom & I, straight from God's heart!

I urge you not to give up on a difficult relationship, no matter how hopelessly & irrevocably broken it may appear. Seek Him with your whole heart, pray and allow Him to work in you in preparation for your own miracle. God still does miracles – at just the right time, His time!
