REVELATION - THE PERFECT STUDY IN LENT!

Note what Rev. 1:3 says!: "Blessed is he who reads and those who hear the words of the prophecy, and heed the things which are written in it; for the time is near."

Please join me for our final installment of the study of the Book of Revelation during Fridays in Lent! We will be looking in detail at chapters 15 - 22 tackling such subjects as the Battle of Armageddon, the rise of Mystery Babylon, the Seven Bowls of God's Wrath, the Millennium, the New Heaven and New Earth, and the Great White Throne Judgement. If you were with us this past weekend you may remember the five reasons I gave for why Revelation is vitally important for every They include (as noted above) 1) There is a blessing when we read, study, and put Revelation into practice 2) It is the culmination and completion of God's plan of salvation for humanity 3) It reveals Who Jesus Christ is, what He has done, is doing, and will do in our future 4) It confronts and judges spiritual and worldly evil once and for all and 5) It calls the Church to worship and It is this last point that we need to delve deeper. For if we are to heed the words of Revelation it will mean that we will understand the importance both Christ-centered worship and repentance play in our daily lives. I will speak more about this on Ash Wednesday and on Friday Nights from 7 - 8:30 PM. Don't forget we also have a meatless coverdish dinner at 6 PM. All are invited to bring a meatless dish to pass in observance of the Anglican tradition of abstaining from meat on Fridays during Lent to remember Christ's death on Good Friday. I look forward to seeing you soon!


