BELONG - EQUIP - REACH!

Many of you know our vision and our mission (hint: its found every month in the Chatter). But how do we actually see the vision and mission of St. Bartholomew's made manifest in our lives and world? What are the ministry values that should undergird all that we say and do? After several months of prayer and discernment, the Core Team and Vestry has affirmed the following three values: **Belong** - **Equip** - **Reach**. In other words, if we are to grow in our walks with Christ and truly show that we have been transformed by His grace and Holy Spirit, these three values should be reflected in our daily lives, both individually and corporately as the Body of Christ. In fact, our new website is organized according to these three values. Please go to www.stbartston.org to see our newly developed website and let us know what you think! But more important than the new website, is living our faith in the real world.

God created us to belong to Him and to His Church. We show this through our baptisms and confirmations, but also through our weekly worship and involvement in His Church, as well as in our families and communities. If I belong to Christ, then the world will see that through how I live my life. To belong, however, also means to be equipped. I can't follow Christ as His disciple unless I am actively being equipped to do His work and will. The Apostle Paul tells us to put on the full armor of God to do battle with spiritual evil in Ephesians 6:10-18, and he tells us that the leadership gifts of the Holy Spirit have been given to equip the saints (you!) for the work of ministry in Ephesians 4:8-14. We need to be equipped, if we are truly going to make a difference and reach the world for Christ! Christ told us in Mt. 28:18-20 to "Go and make disciples of all the nations." He said in Mt. 5:13, that "we are the light of the world." That means we are all called to reach out in Christ's name and by the power of His Spirit as long as we have breath on this earth.





Also new this year we are also going to be collecting boots and gloves for the YWCA of North


Tonawanda. More information about what sizes are needed will be available on the display table in Fr. Amend Hall.
