

St. Bart's Family-

We arrived safely back home from Northern Iraq/Kurdistan on Sunday evening, December 9. It was a phenomenal Spirit filled trip! We definitely got more out of it then we gave. We can't thank St. Bartholomew's Church enough for their monetary donations, blankets, toys and prayers! The money went towards purchasing medications, as you can see from the picture. The blankets were put to good use as the weather was cold. Even in 40 degree weather, we saw many kids walking around without shoes or socks. Very sad sight indeed.

Here is what Father Jerry Kramer, our long-term Missionary in Iraq, has written in his newsletter...

"We are halfway through this week's medical mission to Yezidi and Christian refugees from ISIS and recent Iranian and Turkish aggression/incursions. Our team has cared for hundreds of patients, ministered to children here and, thanks to you, we have purchased medicine for thousands in need. Christians, Yezidi and Kurdish Muslims are all working together as one team; this is a miracle in itself. And it's beautiful. The Kingdom of God is coming upon this troubled region".

Dan worked triage along with another attorney. Dan was in charge of getting histories, taking temperatures, Blood Pressures, Finger-stick Glucoses on all diabetics as well an a Diabetic foot examination. He actually diagnosed heart disease in a Diabetic patient with chest pain that he brought immediately to me. Then, he diagnosed a case of Scabies! For those non-medical folks, Scabies is a very itchy rash due to critters that burrow into the skin and is contagious. Camp Sharya is ground zero for Scabies because of the living conditions (close quarters and everyone in tents) with a huge outbreak so we treated every patient for it along with the entire medical team prophylactically with medication. Father Jerry actually came down with Scabies again.

A typical terribly sad story we hear is about the ISIS orphans. The Father is killed by ISIS and the Mother remarries. The new husband does not want the kids so they are dumped in Camp Sharya with extended family. I saw a 10 year old girl who looked ½ her age and doesn't really speak. Just heart-breaking. We added her to the other 350 ISIS orphans that will go to the Trauma Center that Father Jerry's team has set up in Camp Sharya.

Dan's assistant is a 19 year old Muslim teenager (pictured with Dan) who he is training in triage so that she can continue to work for the team in this capacity. I worked with closely with her Brother in the pharmacy and he is very open to the Gospel. He just starting a discovery Bible Study because of the work with the long-term Missionary Team. Their Father is a big Muslim tribal leader and influential. We were invited to their home on our last night there for dinner.

On the way home, he shared with Dan and I the following testimony...

"You know that I am Muslim but I now pray to Jesus all the time. Peyman told me about Jesus and gave me an Injil (New Testament) that I have been reading. I love Jesus very much. Christian is better than Muslim. Christians are the only ones who come to Iraq to help. Every Christian I meet, I ask them to pray for me".

As Father Jerry says...It is just the very presence of Christians in this area that brings the Kingdom of God where we show the difference. However, once a Muslim is brought into His Kingdom, he is risking his very life. It is best for them to stay a "Muslim Background Believer" as opposed to coming out of the closet (so to speak) because they can bring others into the Kingdom, just as Peyman has done.

I encouraged everyone to consider making a short-term missions trip to Northern Iraq/Kurdistan. We are going again next December, 2019. It is safe and the Lord is moving mightily here!
