ACNA 10th Anniversary Assembly a Great Success!

The clergy of St. Bartholomew's and their wives travelled to Dallas Texas June 17-21 for wonderful time of fellowship and teaching with Anglicans from all over North America and even the world. Junior Warden Rocco Brindisi joined us for the second half of the week for our diocesan assembly. We heard from powerful speakers and had a wonderful celebratory service at Christ Anglican Church in Plano, Texas! The theme of the week was "***Disciple: Renewing Our Call to the Great Commission.***" Jesus gave us our mission in **Mt. 28:18-20** when He said, "***All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to Me. Go, therefore, and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit; teaching them to obey all that I commanded you. And surely I am with you until the end of the age.***" Of course, we can't make disciples until we are disciples. Jesus tells us what it means to be a disciple in **Luke 9:23** when He said, "***If anyone would come after me, let him deny himself and take up his cross daily and follow me.***" The marks of a true disciple involve our 1) focus (are we looking to Jesus in our thinking and for direction rather than ourselves or the world?) 2) time (are we spending time DAILY with the Lord and are we getting enough rest!) and 3) obedience (are we actually putting into action those things we know to be right and of the Lord?). Such things are to be our response to Christ's call. God gives us three blessings to complete our response - 1) the Church (the body of Christ) to be our support and context of growth 2) the Holy Spirit and 3) His Word. Only when these six keys are evident in our life can we truly be disciples. And then we can be the light of Christ to make disciples for the Kingdom of God!

FOOD PANTRY: 28 bags of food were donated in June. Please try to remember the collection is the **first Sunday** of each month. Thank you for your continued support and generosity.




PRAYER FOR REVIVAL: Our next prayer meeting will be Monday, July 15 at 6pm. Note the earlier starting time. Hope to see you there.

PRAYER MINISTRY SPOTLIGHT PRAYERS FOR THE PERSECUTED CHURCH

An Interview with Jim McNamara

What made you interested in Prayers for the Persecuted Church ministry?

God has laid on my heart a concern for persecuted Christians around the world. Prior to coming to St. Bartholomew's in 2011, I had been involved with promoting concerns about the persecuted church at my Methodist Church. I had the opportunity to attend a conference put on by Persecution Ministry International Christian Concern in Washington DC, and had the chance to make presentations to my church. I was very excited to see that not only St. Bartholomew's had a Prayers for the Persecuted Church Ministry, but that it was robust and active.

How has Prayers for the Persecuted Church Ministry changed your prayer life and relationship with God?

It has humbled me, to read story after story of faithful Christians around the world who remain faithful and even joyous in the face of cruel and persistent persecution. In my private prayer time, I am reminded not only to pray for the needs and issues of my loved ones, which certainly are important, but to pray for the millions of Christians who face persecution. While it is difficult, the ministry has also made real what is shown in the Bible: We also need to pray for those who are doing the persecution.

What can a person expect when they engage with the Lord through the PPC ministry?

We welcome all visitors, whether they come for one meeting, or become a regular attender. Each meeting we have a time of scripture, where we see stories of persecution straight from the Bible. This year we looked at passages from the book of Acts. We spend time planning events if we have one upcoming, and usually watch a video about persecution. But most importantly we take ample time every single meeting for prayer. It's no pressure; those who do not feel comfortable praying out loud are not expected to. We have faith that God is using our prayers, silent or spoken to advance his kingdom.

Would you encourage others to become involved in the PPC ministry?

Absolutely, all are welcome, from late teens on. We meet at the Church on the second Monday of the month from September to May. The subject matter is heavy, and not every one is suited for it, but there also is a blessing for those who join us. In addition to the close bonds we share with each other, we have been able to meet persecuted Christians from Iraq, Egypt, and Sudan who have joined us as guests. These meetings have been heartwarming, and we feel that we can be an encouragement to others.
