As the Apostle Paul writes in Philippians 4:4-9: "Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, rejoice! 5Let your gentle spirit be known to all men. The Lord is near. 6Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. 7And the peace of God, which surpasses all comprehension, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.8Finally, brethren, whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is right, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is of good repute, if there is any excellence and if anything worthy of praise, dwell on these things. 9The things you have learned and received and heard and seen in me, practice these things, and the God of peace will be with you." #### **VESTRY NOTES: October 2020**

<u>Vestry Elections:</u> A list of possible vestry candidates is being put together to serve a 3-year term beginning in 2021. As noted last month, due to the Covid pandemic and following the social-distancing protocols, the vestry unanimously voted to have only mail-in voting for the upcoming vestry elections. Ballots (if there are more than four candidates running) will be mailed to all eligible voting members in the first part of November. Ballots need to be returned by the December 10, either by mailing your vote in the stamped, self-addressed return envelope sent with the ballots or by dropping the ballot in the "voting drop box" that will be located in the Fr. Amend Hall.

<u>Fr. Thebeau's Replacement:</u> It is obvious God's hand is at work because on Nov. 1, 2020 Deacon Bush will join St. Bart's full-time staff as a replacement for Fr. Thebeau. In the meantime, he will continue his preparation for his ordination to the priesthood which will be sometime in the new year.




#### **Ladies Tuesday Night Bible Study**
