PRAYER MINISTRY SPOTLIGHT PARENTS IN PRAYER

An Interview with Marie Crosby

What made you interested in Parents in Prayer Ministry?

I began Parents in Prayer out of a need I saw for my own children who were in high school at the time. I had been using Stormie Omartian's book <u>Power of a Praying Parent</u> within my own group of friends and I wanted to share that resource and God's word with other parents as they navigate the challenges of parenting. God did not intend for us to live this life on our own we need the support of others. In addition to praying for our own children we commit to praying for the youth at St. Bartholomews. I believe that when the youth know that their church family is actively praying for them they will then be encouraged to pray for others.

How has it changed your prayer life and relationship with God?

Being a part of this ministry has made my prayer life more focused and intentional. I would say I now have an active prayer life which has redefined my relationship with God. He is my father and in that parent child relationship I have been able to see why I need to be disciplined by him at times. He disciplines out of love for us in the same way that we discipline our children out of love. In Parents in Prayer we not only pray for our children but also for ourselves for us to become the parents that God wants us to be and that our relationship with our children will always glorify God!

What can a person expect when they engage with the Lord through Parents in Prayer?

When you attend Parents in Prayer you are carving out time with the Lord, he honors that. You are bringing your prayers and you are serving others by supporting them in prayer, we are to have a servant's heart. You are in God's word and having some time to be still with Him which is so important if we want to hear his voice. In all of this you are expanding, deepening and strengthening that relationship with Him. It has been my experience that in that time between meetings I am better prepared for some challenges that come my way. When prayer is answered I have a group to come back and share that with. Parents in Prayer is not the only means by which you can experience any and all of the above but for me it has helped me in my parenting and my relationship with the Lord. I have so much more to learn and I look forward to the work my teacher, the Lord God Almighty, has for me and to those that I will meet on that path.

Would you encourage others to become involved in Parents in Prayer for their spiritual and temporal needs?

Absolutely. Parents in Prayer meetings are intentionally scheduled to be held on the same night as Youth Group. I realize that when you are raising a family time is precious and we often take the short time we have during youth group to run errands or maybe just relax. I too did this when my children were younger. Being disciplined to attend Parents in Prayer may be difficult but you will feel refreshed and will know that you have a family that supports your needs and the needs of your family through prayer. If this ministry is not an option for you at this time, that's ok, know that you still have someone praying for you and God will bring you to where you need to be in prayer at His appointed time. In that, we can take comfort.


