Hello St. Barts Family!

Perhaps the most interestingly named day in the Church year is approaching. That day is Maundy Thursday. I always wondered, is it Monday or Thursday? I mean, which is it? It can't be both? Or perhaps this is a line from "The Godfather." No, that was, "Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, Wednesday."

What is Maundy Thursday then? Maundy actually comes from the French word, **Maunde**, which comes from the Latin word, **mandatum** which means 'command.' The clue for the meaning behind the day comes from what Jesus said and did in the upper room on the night before He died for us.

First, let's look at the commands Jesus gave. First, in **John 15:12** we read, "***This is My commandment, that you love one another, just as I have loved you.***" Jesus demonstrated what He meant in **John 13:5-15**. It is there that we read that Jesus, the Lord, washed the feet of the disciples, demonstrating humble service to them. The way that Jesus loves is the way of the cross. He gave Himself up on the cross on our behalf. We, who were His enemies, now have restored relationship with God because of what Jesus did on Mt. Calvary (the cross). Jesus' command to the disciples, and indeed to us, is that we would regard one another as more important than ourselves, be willing to serve one another, and do what is best for one another regardless of what that means for ourselves.

But wait, there's more! Because on Maundy Thursday we also remember the Passover meal that Jesus shared with His disciples. Therein we find another command that Jesus gave. One that we hear every Eucharist service. The command is, ***"Do this in remembrance of Me."*** No longer is the Passover meal merely a reminder of how God led the children of Israel out of their bondage in Egypt. It's much more. It's now a celebration of the victory over our bondage to sin that is ours through Jesus Christ. Whenever we celebrate the Eucharist, we are recognizing the sacrifice of Jesus on the cross; His body broken and His blood shed on our behalf.

We will celebrate the Passover meal (Seder Dinner) and the Eucharist, as we do every year, **on Maundy Thursday, April 17th at 5:30 PM with the Eucharist at 7 PM.** In celebrating both, we see the significance of the Passover meal and how Jesus makes all things new through His death and resurrection. Let us gather together as the body of Christ at that time, and remember the commands that Jesus gave to us: to love one another and to celebrate Christ our True Passover.

FASTING – Jesus expected all of His followers to fast (Mark 2:18-20), and left general directions on our attitude while fasting (Matthew 6:16-18). Our Prayer Book gives the Church's discipline & days of fasting on pg. 689. *Ash Wednesday and Good Friday* are days when all are expected to fast – a minimum for any in good health is to omit at least one meal. Some omit food the entire day, drinking only water. Let the Holy Spirit be your guide, and follow Jesus' direction as given in Matthew's Gospel quoted above.

CARE OF THE PALMS – Blessed Palms are never to be carelessly discarded – but always reverently burned. They can be placed near any religious picture or memento in the home, and burned on the day before Ash Wednesday next year.

LENTEN OFFERING ENVELOPES can be found in the envelope packet you receive in the mail. Extra envelopes will be in the pews if needed. Funds will be given to those in need.

PLEASE REMEMBER THE NEXT FOOD PANTRY COLLECTION is the weekend of May 3rd and 4th. Personal care items such as soap, shampoo, toothpaste, paper products, as well as food items are appreciated. Thanks to all who have donated in the past. Your generosity is greatly appreciated by the NIACAP Food Pantry.

“One of the things in Anglican worship that evokes both confusion and comfort is the sight of the entire congregation reading (or reciting from memory) what critics call a “canned” prayer. If prayer is heartfelt communication with God, how can dozens or hundreds of people use the same words to express their heartfelt desires?

Collects

In ancient practice, when it came time for prayer in the service one of the leaders, a presbyter, or deacon, would announce a topic and “bid” the people to pray for the topic. There followed a period of silence during which people offered their private prayers regarding that particular topic. Sometimes various members of the congregation would pray aloud, leading in prayer from wherever they were. After a few minutes, the leader would summarize or “collect” the prayers and suggest another topic. Over the years the closing summaries became increasingly standardized and the people would sometimes join the leader in saying the “collects” out loud. This outline of prayer (collect) is similar to how our corporate monthly prayer meeting is outlined. This prayer meeting is held the 4th Thursday of each month.

A large selection of these wonderful prayers have been incorporated in our *Book of Common Prayer* (2019) (beginning on page 598-623) and form the basis for the worship of the Anglican Church. Far from being exercises in rote recitation, these are prayers that stretch the mind and faith of those who grow into them through thoughtful repetition and they express, in the best possible language, our best possible thoughts and desires”.

A Letter From our Director

Timing is important, don't you think? You may love salsa, but it's disgusting when eaten at the same time as marshmallow peeps. You may LOVE peeps, but who eats them with orange juice? Yuck!

We may love all kinds of foods, but that doesn't mean eating all our favorite things at one time is a good idea. We also don't brush our teeth and then eat supper. Timing is important.

Timing was also very important when Jesus chose to give his life and die on a cross. Before Jesus died, the Jews were God's special chosen people. But because they sinned—just like we all have done—their most important religious leader, the High Priest, had to make an important sacrifice on behalf of everyone once a year so that they could be forgiven. For hundreds of years a High Priest made this sacrifice on a special Friday every spring during a holy holiday called the "Passover."

God chose for Jesus to die on this special day at the very same time the High Priest offered a perfect, pure lamb as a sacrifice for all the people.

I Corinthians 5:7 says, "Christ, our Passover Lamb, has been sacrificed for us." After Jesus died and rose again there was no longer a need for people to make an animal sacrifice because Jesus became the ultimate sacrifice once and for all.

It wasn't by chance that Jesus died when he did. Jesus' death was all part of God's perfect plan for Him to be the perfect and final sacrifice on behalf of every human's sin."

I challenge you to take time to reflect on what Jesus has done for you and how God would want you to share the sacrifice Jesus made with your friends and family this Easter season.

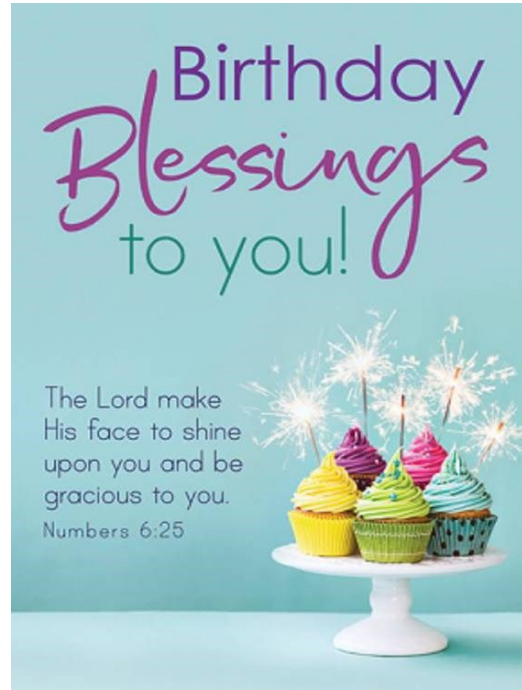
