JoAn Beddome, longtime parish secretary is retiring after forty years of serving the clergy and people of St. Bartholomew's. She was hired by Fr. Amend in August 1983 to work alongside fellow secretary Diane Neil. After Diane's departure in 1984, Fr. Amend hired Mary Krurnowski. Both JoAn and Mary became an outstanding "dynamic duo" keeping the parish office running smoothly and taking care of all the details that come with administrative needs.

When Fr. Ward arrived in September of 1995, JoAn and Mary helped the young curate become familiar with the parish and its ministries. Upon Fr. Amend's retirement in 1998 and Fr. Ward becoming

rector, JoAn and Mary's presence insured a smooth transition. Fr. Ward could always depend upon them. Never once did they "miss a beat."

Mary retired in 2012 but JoAn continued her administrative duties. Regardless, JoAn will be deeply missed and St. Bartholomew's will be forever grateful for the role she played in making our parish a welcoming place and enabling the clergy to minister effectively and efficiently for the Lord and His Kingdom!

meets every Tuesday evening at 6:30pm. We are currently using a video series hosted by Mark Correll, studying the book of Revelation. All men are welcome to join us.



"For a child is born to us, a son is given to us. The government will rest on his shoulders. And he will be called: Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace." – Isaiah 9:6

As you reflect on who Jesus is to you, allow the Word to penetrate your heart. Let go of what is false and cling to what is good. Draw near to Him as He draws near to us once more, as a baby wrapped in swaddling cloths and lying in a manger.


