EPIPHANY - A SEASON OF LIGHT IN THE MIDST OF THE DARKNESS!

The cold and darkness of January is usually unpleasant for most. Outside of winter sports, January in Western New York presents a depressing combo of frigid, cloudy, and short days. The optimism of Christmas and New Year's seems to have passed and we set our minds to endure until spring. And yet in the midst of this "darkness," during the season of Epiphany God reminds us of His marvelous light!

The word "epiphany" comes from a Greek word meaning "manifestation" or "appearance." During Epiphany we remember the manifestation of God's only Son, Jesus Christ: first with the visit of the Magi when He was a child, then with His Baptism and later, His first miracle at a wedding in Cana of Galilee. We begin every worship service in Epiphany with the Old Testament's prophetic words of Isaiah 49:6, "I will make you as a light for the nations, that my salvation may reach to the end of the earth!" Who is this light? The Apostle John tells us in Jn. 1:9: "There is the true Light which, coming into the world, enlightens every man." This true light is Jesus. (Jn. 1:5; 14-18). Thus, Epiphany points us to Jesus as the manifestation of God's True Light!

Later during His ministry Jesus declared, "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will not walk in darkness, but will have the light of life." (Jn. 8:11). What did Jesus mean? As the Light of the world He is the source of all life—everything that has been created. He also is the source of all truth. And with this truth comes understanding - about God, about man, and life's purpose. It is why He said in John 14:6 "I am the way, the truth, and the life, no one comes to the Father but by Me."

Such words remind us of the example of the sun in the natural world. We know there is nothing more powerful and essential to life than sunlight. It is the sun that not only provides the energy in warmth and light that the world needs to live by, but it is by the sun that we see and understand everything around us. It is why Anglican writer and theologian, C.S. Lewis wrote, "I believe in Christianity as I believe that the sun has risen: not only because I see it, but because by it I see everything else."

Just as it is humanly impossible to stop the sun from rising each day, it is humanly and spiritually impossible to prevent Christ from completing His work (Phlp. 1:6) in us! Every challenge, obstacle, and setback is only temporary for the believer! Such matters are opportunities to put our faith in the Light of the World always knowing that "The light (Jesus) shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not (and will not) overcome it!" (Jn. 1:5)



"God is to be praised at every service. He should be thanked for His graciousness and for the blessing He has bestowed. The sick and sorrowing should be lifted up in prayer. The leaders in government should be prayed for. The worldwide Church of Jesus Christ, in all its variety, in missionary endeavor and especially in its tragic division, should be undergirded in prayer.

How many different ways are there to pray for these things? One of the highest priorities of the Book of Common Prayer (BCP) has been to include the people. From the beginning the purpose of the Anglican prayer book was to record prayers to be used in common and by common people. It was and is, the Book of Common Prayer. It was never intended to be used in place of or to the exclusion of private personal prayer."



On pages 642 to 645 is the table of content for 125 prayers that we can pray and include in our daily prayers.

As we move into this New Year let's take a closer look at "The Prayers of the People". We pray these each Sunday and for the next few months we can take these home with us and carry them in our daily prayer.

The "Prayers of the People" start on page 128 of the 2019 Book of Common Prayer with "For the peace of the whole world and for the well being and unity of the people of God".

So when you pray "For the peace of the whole world" you can go to the prayers on page 654 #27 and #28 and include them.

Then "for the well being and unity of the people of God" go to the prayers on page 646, #1 through 4, and page 658, #40 and page 659, #42 and pray and meditate on them.

You get the idea? Let us know how you did. More next month.

Our February meetings will be the 11th and 25th.





St. Bart's has scheduled a build for *Sleep in Heavenly Peace* on March 15 from 8:45am-12pm at the Eastern Hills shop location. The build is open to the entire

congregation but for this build there are only 15 spots available.

Age Requirements: Ages 16 and over are able to come to the shop on their own. Ages 13-15 need to have one adult for every 10 in this age range. Ages 8-12 each need to bring an adult with them. The adult will be placed at a station working side by side with the child. Typical tasks for this group are sanding, sorting and wrapping bed slats and sorting and wrapping screws and washers.


