Hello St. Bart's family! Once again we flip the calendar to a new year. This next year might seem longer than the year we just went through, because it is by one day. But that just means we have an extra day this year to listen to God, to obey God, and to allow Him to work in us and through us. Spending the extra time with the Lord will make 2024 be better than 2023 by "leap"s and bounds!" So lets hop to it!

In my reflections on the past year and the prospect of the new year, two Scriptures came to mind. The first is **Acts 3:19**. In Acts 3 we see the Apostle Peter preaching in the Temple about Jesus. And he tells his fellow Jews that the proper response to Jesus' death and resurrection is to "repent and return." What are the benefits of this? Peter states that the benefits are, "that your sins may be wiped away, in order that times of refreshing may come from the presence of the Lord." Having our sins wiped away is probably the more obvious benefit of repentance. Less obvious is those times of refreshing that come from the presence of the Lord.

We all experience times in our lives where a little refresh feels needed. But here Peter tells us that the times of refreshing that we need most come from having the presence of the Lord in our lives. It is the Lord that gives us the proper perspective on whatever situation we find ourselves in. It is in the presence of the Lord that the things of earth grow strangely dim. It is in the presence of the Lord that we find real encouragement to continue on in the faith knowing that He will meet our needs. This is the true refreshment that all of us need.

The second Scripture is **Philippians 3:13-14.** "Brethren, I do not regard myself as having laid hold of it yet; but one thing I do: forgetting what lies behind and reaching forward to what lies ahead, I press on toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus." We can be tempted to look back at mistakes and sins we have committed in the past and repented from already and allow them to shape our attitude and perspective now. (**Continued on Page 2**)

We can be tempted to look at what we once had and think that better than what we have now, as the Israelites did in the desert when they desired to return to Egypt. But we must avoid both of those. Forget what lies behind. It is done and over with. When we repent, God forgives our sin. It is as far from us as the east is from the west. Forget what we once had. We need to look at what we have now in Christ and look forward to what we will have in the future because of what Jesus has done for us. Let us strive for that prize.

No matter our perspective on it, let us not dwell on 2023. May we instead move always forward in Christ Jesus our Lord. Seeking Him, spending time with Him, that each day we may experience the refreshment to our souls provided for us only because of the presence of Almighty God in our lives. Amen!

Don't throw out your Christmas tree on December 26th!

(Unless it's all dried up and looks like something out of a horror movie, hold on to your tree for all twelve days of Christmas!)

By the time December 25th rolls around, most of us are just about done with Christmas. After all, we've been listening to Christmas music since Thanksgiving, attended parties, bought and exchanged gifts, baked cookies, decorated our house, and watched every one of our favorite holiday movies. It's been Christmas non-stop, and we're ready for it to be over, even though we understand that Christmas day is the first day of the season. Why the burn out?

You may have heard someone at one time describe people as "creatures of habit." For example, you eat the same breakfast every morning, or keep the same schedule, or maintain certain family traditions. We all have habits, or routines, that inform the minutes and hours of each day, with some habits so entrenched that we have difficulty when it comes to changing them. Undergirding our habits and routines is a basic rhythm. When we're locked in with the rhythm of our lives, we feel focused, joyful, maybe energized, like we're moving forward. When we're "out of step," then we feel stressed, flustered, and overwhelmed. Whoever, or whatever, sets our life's rhythm, will form the habits and routines that it supports and, ultimately, the outcome that results.

This is why we become so burned out by December 25th, and why we throw out our trees on the 26th. Our rhythms have been set by our secular, consumer-driven society and not by the Church. The world tells us to "run, run, Rudolph" because Santa is in a hurry, while the Church says, "God rest ye merry, gentlemen," because the Lord, the Prince of Peace, has come. If we want to experience the peace and joy that is ours in Christ, we need to disconnect from the world's rhythms and get in sync with Christ's.

One tool designed to help us in this regard is the Church calendar. Each season points to a specific event in the life of Christ and calls us to joyous celebration or deeper reflection as it pertains to us both personally and corporately. Following the Church calendar will help us lock in to better heavenly rhythms, so start today by keeping up the Christmas cheer for all twelve days... and after you can throw out your tree.


PRAYERS FOR THE NEW YEAR


be more merciful towards others and
