#### Hello Brothers and Sisters of St. Bartholomew's!

As many of you know, I (Nicholas Sluyter), was recently ordained as a priest, and we are now in the early stages of planting a new Anglican church in the Southtowns of Buffalo, **AND WE NEED YOUR HELP!** 

We all want to be part of something bigger than ourselves. Seventy years ago people gathered together and spread the word so that St. Bartholomew's could be established. In the same way, **you now have the opportunity to be part of starting a new church community in the Southtowns of Buffalo**, that by God's grace will have that same legacy of raising up disciples of Jesus Christ.

Buffalo is one of the most post-Christian cities in the entire nation. Buffalo needs the gospel.

As we have been discerning God's call for ministry over the last few years, several opportunities for pastoring established churches came up, and I ended up turning those opportunities down. Each time, they just didn't sit right with me. Each time we considered leaving Buffalo it seemed that God was inviting us to stay. God has given me a heart and passion for seeing Buffalo transformed, even if I only play one small part in his much bigger plan.

Our mission is to plant a church where people experience life together in fellowship, not just as an event to attend but as a community to belong to. A church where our worship is focused on glorifying God. A church where each person is being formed into the image of Christ and growing to spiritual maturity as we study the Scriptures. And as we grow in depth as a community, we want our church to be a place where people are coming to put their trust in Jesus and follow him as Lord.

**So how can you be part of this mission? Connect us with people you know in the Southtowns!** (Especially in the area of South Buffalo, Hamburg, Orchard Park, Cheektowaga, West Seneca, etc)

In this first step, we are growing our core group of members who want to be part of starting something new. Will you invite one or more people that you know who are in the Southtowns to consider visiting and joining our church? If every member of St. Bartholomew's invited just ONE person to come check out our church plant, I'm sure we would grow immensely!

Prayer, our deepest longings.

"When a doctoral student at Princeton asked, "What is there left in the world for original dissertation research? Albert Einstein replied, "Find out about prayer. Somebody must find out about prayer."

"Every faith has some form of prayer. We pray because we want to thank someone or something for the beauties and glories of life, and also because we feel small and helpless and sometimes afraid. We pray for forgiveness, for strength, for someone else, for contact with the One who is, for assurance that we are not alone.

Prayer is universal because it speaks to some basic human need.

According to Gallup polls, more Americans will pray this week than will exercise, drive a car, or go to work. Nine in ten of us pray regularly and three out of four claim to pray every day. To get some idea of the interest in prayer, type "prayer" or "pray" in an internet engine like Google and see how many millions of links pop up. Yet behind those impressive numbers lies a mystery."
