St. Bartholomew's Welcomes MARGARET BUKKOSY as Our New Director of Music Ministries!

Margaret Bukkosy has been recently appointed as our *Director of Music Ministries* and comes to St. Bartholomew's from the Anglican Church of the Holy Trinity in South Carolina, where she served for 12 years. Her first love has always been providing instrumental and choral music for worship services. She had her first paid organist position at the age of 12 and has been involved in providing church music for worship ever since. Before moving to South Carolina she spent over 30 years as Director of Music at *St. James United Church of Christ* in Hamburg, NY, and over 20 years as a music teacher in the Hamburg Central Schools during which time she served nine years as Chair of the Music Department.

A graduate of SUNY at Fredonia with a Master of Music in Organ Performance, she has New York State Certifications both as a music teacher and as a school district administrator (M.S. Canisius College) for Kindergarten through Grade 12. Her undergraduate degree, B.A. cum laude, was earned at the State University of New York at Buffalo, with a concentration in Organ. She is certified as a state-level *Dimensions of Learning Trainer*, a model which gives classroom teachers techniques



to incorporate Critical Thinking Skills into their lesson plans. Margaret is also an accomplished planist.

She has directed choirs of all ages and coached solo singers throughout her career. Adult choirs have performed extended works in worship and concerts under her direction. Her children's choirs have been involved in performing religious musicals and were invited by WNED to perform *"David and The Giant"* on television. She has produced over 30 secular and sacred musicals including the full-length Broadway version of *"Joseph and The Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat"* on two separate occasions.

Margaret has earned numerous awards. New York State recognized her for excellence in grant writing after she saved the Gowanda Central School District \$250,000. She was named *The Innovative Teacher of the Year* by the Hamburg Central School District in 1993. Hilbert College cited her many contributions to the college by promoting her to Adjunct Assistant Professor, where she taught for 7 years.

She has been appointed to many boards and served as president of a number of musicrelated organizations, including *Choristers Guild* and the *Erie County Council of Music Coordinators.* She has presented workshops for the New York State School Music Association (NYSSMA), the American Guild of Organists, the Board of Cooperative Educational Services (BOCES), as well as many area school districts.

Margaret and her husband Steven recently returned to New York to be near family and friends. They have two daughters, Sara and Laura, and two grandchildren, Dorian and Zac. Her hobbies include designing and making church banners, baking, cooking, reading, boating, and kayaking. She loves nature and all of God's creation, avidly watching the birds, turkeys, and deer who gravitate to the backyard bird feeder.

She played her first service at St. Bartholomew's this past Christmas Eve, and had been working as a substitute organist until being hired as our Director of Music Ministries on April 1. She is looking forward to meeting more members of the congregation and encouraging people of all ages to join one of the choirs of the church. *"He who sings, prays twice!"* (a favorite quote of hers from St. Augustine).

In summing up her time with us so far, Margaret said, *"I love the warmth and friendliness of the members, their commitment to Jesus Christ, and the fact that such a large congregation feels like one big family. The Anglican liturgy is beautiful and historic, and the preaching at St. Bart's is extraordinary. St. Bart's is a blessing to me in every respect because I can share my passion for church music with the choirs and congregation."*

We are truly blessed to have Margaret with us and look forward to her work in leading and developing our music ministries in the worship of the Lord!

Instrumentalists should be able to read a simple music score. If the instrument you play is not listed, please check with Jim.

On June 15th, the singers and the instrumentalists will rehearse together in the sanctuary to prepare two selections for the June 19th service. The other will be announced at rehearsal and will be a familiar piece.


Women's Tuesday Night Bible Study


