MAY MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

St. Bart's & the 21st Century: Change is sometimes a slow and costly process. While St. Bart's is continually trying be "up to date", the Vestry is continually looking for ways to remain so. As a result, the Vestry is excited to let you know they are considering several possible changes to help both young and old with making it easier for everyone to stay "in the know" as it pertains to St. Bart's. First, you may have noticed we are now using a QR code that will take you directly to RebelGive to help make it less cumbersome to give a donation. (Speaking of donations, please note that any holiday offerings are fully given away as a donation to charities decided on by the Vestry. None of those offerings are in the budget nor are they used towards the on-going expenses of St. Bart's. Therefore, you are encouraged to give your "normal" donation in addition to any special offerings. This will greatly help with keeping within our annual budget.)

Next, in addition to the QR codes, the Vestry is also looking into the possibility and feasibility of having a St. Bart's app. It is hoped the app will make it easier for anyone to access information you may want or need at your fingertips. Things like providing details about upcoming events, contact information for staff and clergy, how to be a part of the various ministries, a direct link to RebelGive, etc. Please note: the app will not replace the website, although the Vestry acknowledges the need to update our website since it's been many years (believe it or not) when it was first developed; this will be another item the Vestry is pursuing in the future.

<u>Rivendell Update:</u> The Vestry would like to say "hats off" to the Rivendell students who put on an awesome theatrical presentation of Paul Bunyan's <u>Pilgrims Progress</u>. In addition, the Vestry would like to give a big "thank you" to Rivendell for providing the new furniture in the atrium on the second floor as well as for the purchase of a 14,000 BTU A/C unit. It is the Vestry's understanding they are also planning to purchase two addition A/C units for use in two more classrooms. Way to go Rivendell!

<u>New Computers:</u> Isn't it amazing how quickly our computers become out of date and obsolete. While we've been blessed in that we've been able to put band aids on our computers with repairs from time to time, the time has come when these are no longer a viable option. Therefore, the Vestry approved the purchase of three new computers, with the funds coming from the Arise and Build monies. (Thank you to those of you who continue to give to this fund. If you'll recall, the monies in this fund are used for "special need" items that were not budgeted.)

Sheridan Drive Entrance Pot Holes: What you may or may not know, technically, the Sheridan Drive entrance is a continuation of Montrose Ave., located on the other side of Sheridan Drive. That means the Town of Tonawanda owns that part of the property. Despite that fact, it is our responsibility to maintain that area. While our Sexton, Jim Kibby, can do a "cold-patch repair", it is only a short-term fix. Therefore, another project the Vestry will be looking into is getting the pot holes repaired with a more permanent fix. (Again, this is something where the monies may come from the Arise & Build Fund so please don't hesitate to give, making sure you mark "Arise & Build" on your check or look for Arise & Build on RebelGive. Either way, another thank you to everyone for your continued support!)



PRAYER MINISTRY TEAM

2 Chronicles 33:10-17

(ODB May 5) "Manasseh, king of Judah, rebelled against God. As a result, he was taken captive to Babylon. But "in his distress he sought the favor of the Lord," and "when he prayed," God "brought him back to Jerusalem and to his kingdom" (2 Chronicles 33:12-13). Manasseh spent the rest of his rule in peace, serving God and doing his best to undo the wrongs he'd done before.

"The Lord was moved" by Manasseh's prayer (v. 13). God responds to humility. When we realize we need to make a change in the way we're living and turn to Him, He never turns us away. He meets us with grace we don't deserve and renews us with the self-giving love He poured out at the cross. New beginnings begin with Him.

Manasseh *humbly* prayed to God, was returned to his throne in Jerusalem, and ended his reign seeking to right his many wrongs (**vv. 10-17**). Likewise, we can humbly pray and turn to God for a fresh start.




