ANOTHER SEASON OF LENT!

As we continue our reflections on the church seasons we now come to the most challenging season of them all - LENT! Lent is an opportunity for us to not only reflect on sin's destructive nature but to remember what Jesus had to go through to overcome it. While Advent focuses on the coming of Christ, Christmas His Incarnation, and Epiphany the Light of His revelation, it is during Lent that we come face to face with His suffering. Jesus became like us not only to communicate God personally and perfectly, but to suffer and die for mankind. His suffering and death not only exposed the evil of sin but also revealed the love of God. Many know John 3:16: "For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have eternal life." However, it is Romans 5:8 that tells us how that love was shown when the Apostle Paul wrote, "But God demonstrates His own love towards us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us."

God's love for us is not only sacrificial but it's unconditional! God doesn't love us because, if, or when we do something, He loves us period. Romans 8:38-39 tells us that "nothing can separate us from the love of God which is in Christ Jesus our Lord!" And yet, there is one thing that can get in the way to experiencing the love of God - the self! When we turn from the love of God we lose the very life source and reason for living. We still live in a dark world and we still do battle with our selfish human nature. The only way to grow in the love of Christ is to spend time with Him. That is how we are filled with the Holy Spirit. Recall that after praying and fasting for 40 days, Jesus was tempted by the devil and then that He was led by the Holy Spirit to begin His ministry (Lk. 4:1-15). Such times of prayer and fasting enable us to walk in faith and repentance each and every day.


PRAYER MINISTRY TEAM

Our March meetings will be the 11th and 25th.





"But when he was still a long way off, his father saw him and was filled with compassion for him; he ran to his son, threw his arms around him and kissed him." Luke 15:20

Have you ever felt like you messed up so badly that you couldn't come back from it? Maybe you hurt someone, made a bad choice or drifted away from God. It happens to all of us. The good news? God is always ready to take us back.

In the story of the Prodigal Son from Luke 15, the younger son completely wastes his life-he makes terrible choices and ends up feeling lost and empty. But when he finally decides to return home, his father doesn't scold him or push him away. Instead, he runs toward him with open arms.

That's exactly how God sees you. No matter how far you've strayed, He is always ready to welcome you back. But repentance isn't just about feeling bad for what you've done. It's about making a decision to change. It's about realizing that life apart form God isn't fulfilling, and choosing to come home to Him.

The season of Lent is a time to get real with ourselves and recognize our need for God and remember that without God, we are nothing, but with Him, we have everything. It's also a call to repentance, to turn away from sin and let go of our pride, so I encourage you during this season of Lent to think about an area of your life where you know you need to turn back to God. Maybe its your attitude, the way you treat others, or a habit that pulls you away from Him. Say a short prayer asking God for strength to change and come home to Him.
