PRAYER According to LUKE...

Of the four gospels, Luke includes the most on the subject of prayer. In light of the serious challenges we are facing as a nation I can't think of a greater motivator to pray than God's Word and Jesus' example. Luke recounts how Jesus prayed as the heavens opened up at his baptism (Lk. 3:21). He tells us that Jesus often withdrew to pray alone (Lk. 5:16) and prayed all night before He made the decision of choosing the Twelve Apostles (Lk. 6:12). In Lk. 9:18, Jesus again is found praying alone, this time before asking the disciples who they think He is. Later in Lk. 9:28-36 Jesus goes with Peter, James, and John up on the mountain to pray where He is then transfigured before their very eyes. In Lk. 10:21-22 Jesus prays to thank God the Father in the Holy Spirit for concealing and revealing His spiritual truths to the wise and those young in the faith. Before Jesus teaches His disciples to pray in Lk. 11:1-4 we find Jesus again praying! Later in Lk. 22:17-19, on the night before He was crucified Jesus prays and gives thanks for the bread and the cup during the Last Supper. He then tells Peter that He has prayed that Peter's faith will not fail (Lk. 22:32). In the Garden of Gethsemane Jesus prays to the Father that if possible to let the cup (His suffering and death) pass (Lk. 22:41). He prays more earnestly in Lk. 22:44 after acknowledging that His Father's will be done.

Throughout Luke's account, we find many teachings on prayer by Jesus. These include the Lord's Prayer in Lk. 11:1-4 as well as two parables unique to Luke on the importance of persistence and perseverance in our prayer life (Lk. 11:5-13 & 18:1-7). In a third parable, Jesus contrasts the prayers of the Pharisee and the tax collector (Lk. 18:9-14). Jesus also teaches His disciples to pray for those who abuse them (Lk. 6:28). In. Lk. 10:2 He calls on us to pray that the Lord of the harvest would send out laborers into the harvest. He says that the Temple should be a house of prayer in Lk. 19:46. Finally in Lk. 21:36, Jesus warns the disciples to pray for strength to face the things that will soon take place and that they not fall into temptation (Lk. 22:40, 46).

I encourage you to use the Anglican Book of Common Prayer and the Bible to assist in that endeavor. Prayer is communication with God - it includes speaking to the Lord in praise, confession, thanksgiving and supplication (petition). But it also means taking time out to listen to the still small voice of the Holy Spirit. The only way we can do this is to stop what we're doing, go to a quiet place and rest in the Lord. Jesus did so daily while He walked this earth. How much more should we!


