THE KEY TO TRUE TRANSFORMATION IS ...?

According to our church's vision statement, a personal relationship with the Lord Jesus Christ is the key. But what makes this relationship truly transformational? First, we need to know into whose likeness we are supposed to be transformed. The answer is found in many Scriptures, but Paul sums it up in this way in Romans 8:29, "For those whom He foreknew, He also predestined to become conformed to the image of His Son." In other words, God wants us to become like His Son, Jesus Christ! We become like Jesus by abiding in Him as a branch abides in a vine (Jn. 15:1-8). But how do we abide? We abide through the worship of the Triune God-Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. What is worship? Worship reflects that which we value most in life. It is why our English word, "worship" comes from the old English word, "worthship." Whatever is most important in our lives is what we worship. So when we speak of worshipping God - it means putting Him first in all areas of our lives - our time, our relationships, our work, our money -but ultimately our hearts! Jesus highlighted this when He said in Mt. 6:21, "for where your treasure is, there will be your heart be also." Everyone worships every day. God created our hearts for worship. The question always is are we worshipping the Creator or the created? Idolatry is the sin of worshipping the created.

The great 16th century reformer, John Calvin, wrote that "our hearts are idol making factories." Whenever we put something before God - our self, our money, our work, our leisure, other people, other religions, any other thing - we are committing idolatry. It shouldn't surprise us that idolatry is the most common sin mentioned in the Old Testament. Jesus was tempted to commit idolatry in all three of His temptations by the devil after He had fasted and prayed in the wilderness for forty days. The most direct example of the three, however, was when the devil showed Jesus all the kingdoms of the world and said that they could be the Lord's if he only would bow down and worship him (the devil.) How did Jesus respond? He rebuked the devil with the Word of God and said in Lk. 4:8 and quoting Dt. 6:13, "It is written, "You shall worship the Lord Your God and serve Him only!" What we worship is the central issue in life. Otherwise, the first four of the Ten Commandments wouldn't be centered on worship! (Ex. 20:3-10)

It is why Jesus said in Jn. 4:24, "God is spirit, and those who worship Him must worship in spirit and truth." The truth is that we will never have peace or joy until we worship the Living God consistently. The great theologian of the early Church, St. Augustine wrote, "You have made us for yourself, O Lord, and our heart is restless until it rests in you."

Worship, therefore, is more than simply trying harder to be a better person. It is more than positive thinking based on God's Word. It is more than reading and studying God's Word. It is more than going to church every Sunday. It is more than praying a few prayers. Such practices are vitally important. In fact, they should be incorporated as part of our worship. But worship is meant to be a full spirit, soul and body experience!

It begins with a commitment to refocus all of one's priorities. The most fundamental starting point being spending time with God in prayerful reflection and immersion in God's Word *every day*. If we do not spend time with God in this manner - our transformation in this life is impossible! We may still be saved but *spiritually we will remain stagnant*. Our worship time should focus on the nature of God (His goodness, majesty, glory and so forth), what God has done in history and in our own lives, and what God has promised for our future. It should include reflection on our own shortcomings (sins and failures) and a renewed commitment to be about God's Kingdom as we receive mercy and forgiveness. It should include prayers not just for others and our world but for our work and involvement in our church family. Worshipful prayer also includes consistently looking at how we are ordering our lives. Is what we are doing and how we are handling our resources lining up with the priorities of God's Kingdom.

Our worship is also to be expressed publicly and corporately. It is why we are told in Hebrews 10:25 says, "do not forsake...assembling together, as is the habit of some," and why Jesus said in Mt. 18:20, "For where two or three have gathered together in my name, I am there in their midst." It is to be expressed in the way we live and act. Paul writes in Rom. 12:1, "Therefore I urge you, brethren, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies a living and holy sacrifice, acceptable to God, which is your spiritual service of worship." The truth is we become like what we worship and we end up becoming a slave of the one whom we worship (Rom. 6:15-16; 2 Pet. 2:19)..

So what is the key to being transformed into Christ's likeness? It is abiding in relationship with Christ by worshipping the One True God - forever, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit! It involves our entire being - spirit, soul, and body. It is what will lead to true peace and joy! Happy Easter!

The book of Hebrews tells us that "we do not have a high priest (Jesus) who cannot sympathize with our weaknesses, but One who has been tempted in all things as we are, yet without sin" (Heb. 4:15). What does that mean? It means that Jesus has compassion for us and understands our plight because He experienced it firsthand though unlike us, He never sinned (which matters in establishing His high priesthood and securing our salvation).

The fact that He never sinned doesn't cheapen His experience in "our shoes," He dealt with the same emotions and struggles we deal with. We see this clearly when we read the Gospels. Jesus understands us like no one else can or ever will. Even when Peter and the other disciples expressed doubt, Jesus didn't kick them out or scold them; He challenged them and encouraged them in their faith. Just like when Jacob wrestled with God in the Old Testament, Jesus is willing to wrestle with us in our doubt.

This month I challenge you to take your questions and your doubts into the ring with Jesus, to trust that He is bigger than your doubts and that you will find grace to help you in your time of need (Heb. 4:16). Feel free to bring those doubts to Youth Group too! I would love to discuss them with you and pray with you.






