### WHAT HAPPENS IN ISRAEL MATTERS!

The horrible events of the last few weeks have brought the world's attention back to Israel. As students of God's Word, we shouldn't be surprised. The Bible makes clear that before Christ returns, Israel will be at the center of the world's attention. In fact, the Old Testament prophets predict that Israel's Messiah will come to Jerusalem during a time when the city is besieged by the world's armies (**Zechariah chs.12 &14**). It is why Jesus warns of terrible conflict in the Holy Land as a sign prior to His coming back to earth (**Luke 21:20-24**).

But what happens in Israel also matters to us as Christians and Americans today. Israel represents the only truly free democratic nation in the Middle East. It upholds the rights of freedom of speech, the press, the right to assembly, and religion. And yet, it is surrounded by nations who reject such values and call for its destruction. Such hatred was on full display this past October 7, To add insult to injury, Hamas attacked Israel on the Sabbath. It committed atrocities of the worst kind, murdering over 1400 Jews, the single greatest number since the days of the Holocaust.

Such evil flows from the spirit of the evil one, the devil. Jesus warned the world of this evil when He said in **John 10:10**, "the thief comes only to steal, kill, and destroy." But then Jesus continued and said, "but I came that they may have life and have it abundantly." Therein lies the hope for the entire world. It is only when both Muslim and Jew, Palestinian and Israeli, turn to the Prince of Peace that they will have the inner, lasting peace that brings true reconciliation.

As Christians we are called to stand against the forces of evil both temporally and spiritually. However, the spiritual is most important. We cannot allow hate and anger to replace love and charity. We must work to protect all people here in the United States against prejudice and bigotry.

We must support Israel's defense and right to exist as well as efforts to protect the innocent on both sides. Jesus said to "love for your enemies and pray for those who persecute you" (Mt. 5:44). St. Paul warns us to take up the spiritual armor in Ephesians 6:13-17 knowing that "our struggle is not against flesh and blood but against the rulers, the powers, the world forces of this darkness, against the spiritual forces of wickedness in the heavenly places." (Eph. 6:12).

It is during times of trial and tribulation that our faith is most tested. We can either shrink back in fear and let worry and anxiety rule our hearts, or we can double down on the promises of God's Word - that God is sovereign and in complete control. Nothing happens without His permission. All that is going on in the Middle East and the world is preparing all humanity, the entire universe, for the return of the Kings of kings and Lord of lords - Jesus Christ! When we recognize such true promises, then we can joyfully heed Jesus' words, "But when these things begin to take place, straighten up and lift up your heads, because your redemption is drawing near." (Luke 21:28).

# **VESTRY**

### **SEPTEMBER**

New air conditioning units will be installed in the Fr. Amend Hall, replacing the old, original units. Installation is set for the Spring of 2024.

Support for Nick & Lauren Sluyter: A \$3000 donation from St. Bart's was given to this couple in support of their on-going ministry work at Buffalo State College.

Two new, updated defibrillators will be purchased, one for upstairs and one for the main floor.

Three new cameras will be purchased to replace the three that are not working. In support for the widows and orphans of three lay leaders who were gunned down in Northern Iraq last month, a \$1500 donation was given to the Kramer's ministry, *Love for the Least*.

## **OCTOBER**

New signs will be installed at the main entrance and administrative office doors.

A \$5,000 donation will be sent in support for the good work of Bishop Andudu of the Anglican Diocese of Kadugli in Sudan. He also oversees the local Sudanese congregation that meets at St. Bart's. His diocese is responding to refugees and those in need in the Nuba mountains of Sudan, the area where the Diocese is located. As a result of the renewed Civil War in Sudan, many are suffering and have left the capital, fleeing to the Nuba Mountains. Many are also coming to Christ because of these efforts of support.

The 2024 budget was unanimously approved by the Vestry.

The 2024 annual elections will be held on the weekend of December 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup>, before and after all services. At least four candidates will be running for three Vestry positions. If you would like to run for Vestry, please see Fr. Ward. More information will be forthcoming as we near these dates.




# **BIBLE STUDIES**


