THE ELECTION, THE KINGDOM OF GOD, AND OUR RESPONSE

Are you worried about this year's election? You're not alone. A poll done earlier this year by the American Psychiatric Association of 2200 adults found that 73% are anxious about the presidential election. Such anxiety shouldn't surprise us in light of the divisive nature of today's political discourse. It's easy to look around and feel like things are out of control. Certainly, the moral trends in our land are disturbing. The quest for true righteousness seems to have been lost. How do we make sense of it all and what should be our response?

As followers of the One True God revealed in the Lord Jesus Christ, we must remember what Jesus said to Pontius Pilate, the Roman Governor, when He was brought before him to be crucified. Recall that throughout His ministry Jesus confronted political and religious power. After He was accused of blasphemy and then sedition by the Jewish religious authorities, they turned him over to Pilate. We read in John that after Pilate sarcastically said, "You are the king of the Jews?" Note how Jesus replied: "My kingdom is not of this world. If My kingdom were of this world, My servants would be fighting so that I would not be handed over to the Jews; but as it is, My kingdom is not of this realm." Pilate then doubled down on his initial statement and said again, "So You are a king?" Jesus answered, "You say correctly that I am a king. For this purpose I have been born, and for this I have come into the world: to testify to the truth. Everyone who is of the truth listens to My voice."

In that one statement, Jesus summed up the essence of His ministry and purpose - to testify to the truth about the source and reason for everything and to lead people into His truth. Recall earlier that Jesus said He embodies truth and that He is the only way to a perfect relationship with His Father (Jn. 14:6). The kingdom of which Jesus speaks, is the Kingdom of God. As believers who have been born again, we are citizens of this Kingdom. And yet, even though our true citizenship is in heaven, our work is here on earth! We have been called out of the darkness of sin and death and into His marvelous light in order to go back into the darkness of this world and let our lights shine! It is how we make a difference for the Kingdom of God.

Thus, in light of Jesus' example, as we approach this vitally important election we must remember four key responsibilities: 1) work on our attitude towards others, especially those with whom we disagree - love, humility, selflessness must always be our motivation (Rom. 12:14-18; Philp 2:4-5) 2) pray, pray and then pray! - we are told to pray for our leaders and for a peaceful life! (I Tim. 2:1-4; Philp 4:6-8) 3) be involved in your church and community - we are called by Jesus to GO into the world and engage with those around us (Mt. 5:14-16; 28:19-20) and 4) finally vote! (Mt. 22:21) The great theologian, Augustine of Hippo (354-430) famously wrote in his monumental multi-volume work, *The City of God*, that to be a good citizen of heaven means to be a good citizen in the "city of man." As Americans who have been given the right and privilege to elect our leaders as our representatives, that *includes* voting. Let's face it, if most Bible believing Christians actually voted - a simple act of obedience to God's call to be responsible citizens - our impact would be far greater!

Of course, when it comes to voting, it is important that we know the issues and which candidates align most with a biblical worldview. That may seem difficult these days as both sides fall short of true righteousness. But it is important that we do our research and we listen to the voices of those we respect. Then pray and vote your conscience! I will speak more about the upcoming election and our response the weekend before Nov. 5th. I hope to see you in church!

Prayer is how we communicate with God and something we're told to do continually. (1 Thessalonians 5:17).

Sharing our news (good or bad) with God, even though He already knows all about us, is helpful as it shifts our focus and helps us think about Him.

Sometimes our prayers will take the form of words, but often it will be a wordless reaching out to Him. It's possible to "pray continually" because Christ's Spirit unites our hearts to God's, continually assuring us of His love for us as His children (Romans 8:16).

Other times "we do not know what we ought to pray for, but the Spirit himself intercedes for us through wordless groans. ²⁷ And he who searches our hearts knows the mind of the Spirit, because the Spirit intercedes for God's people in accordance with the will of God. ²⁸ And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him, who have been called according to his purpose". (Roman 8:26-28)

Lastly, as we approach the November 5 elections, "I urge, then, first of all, that petitions, prayers, intercession and thanksgiving be made for all people— ² for kings and all those in authority, that we may live peaceful and quiet lives in all godliness and holiness. ³ This is good, and pleases God our Savior, ⁴ who wants all people to be saved and to come to a knowledge of the truth". (1 Timothy 2:1-4)



A Letter From our Director

Did you know you can make the best part of Thanksgiving last all year long? No, that doesn't mean you can hide your Nana's famous pie under your bed and eat it in July. The delicious food on the table may not keep, but the joy and peace that come from thanking God for your many blessings can and should be a year-round thing!

There are some commands that are repeated over and over again throughout Scripture. The most common is, "Do not be afraid." This phrase is in the Bible 365 times! But God doesn't just tell us not to worry or be afraid. He also tells us how to fight those feelings. Check out the next most repeated phrases in the Bible: "Praise God" "Rejoice" "Give thanks"

God wants us to have hearts full of joy and peace, always. And he tells us that the way to do that is through giving thanks – not just by being grateful for our things, but by giving thanks to God. When we praise God, rejoice, and show him gratitude for all the good things he has made and provided, it's much easier to feel the daily joy and peace he wants for us.

The Bible tells us over and over again to be thankful. Always, without ever stopping! When you practice this, it makes you happy. For example, in 1 Thessalonians 5:16-18 it says, "Rejoice always, pray continually, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus." So, why should we dedicate just one day a year to saying all the things we're thankful for? How can we get in the habit of showing gratitude every single day? Search the Bible for verses about gratitude. Then, think about what God is telling you about being grateful. How often does he want you to show gratitude? What feelings come from gratefulness? What feelings come from being ungrateful?

Here are a few ways you and your family can make gratitude – and the peace and joy that come with it – part of your life every day.

- Make a gratitude jar full of ideas to help you feel thankful. Pull out an idea or two to discuss at mealtimes or on car rides.
- 2. Bake a treat or do a chore for people who have helped you.
- 3. Write thank-you notes to people who have been kind to you
- 4. Play a game of family charades using the things each person is grateful for as your prompts.
- 5.Go on a gratitude hike or walk around your neighborhood. As you walk, thank God for things you see in nature, for your neighbors, or for your favorite shops and places.
- 6.Pray every morning when you get up and each night before bed, thanking God for the things you hope will be and for the best parts of your day.


