A Letter From Susan Morris in Uganda

Dear friends,

I am writing this with a heavy heart but sure of the way God is leading me. After much prayer and agonizing over this decision, it has become clear that due to health issues with my parents, I need to leave Uganda and return to Florida. My departure is this coming Monday, June 3rd.

As many of you know, my mother has been in a nursing home with advanced Alzheimer's disease for quite some time. My step-father has been visiting her twice a day and making sure she is receiving the care she needs. Since, for the past five or six years, she has not known me or is at all aware of when I would visit, I was confident in God's call to go ahead and come to Uganda. However, now my step-father's health is deteriorating so much that he is not going to be able to continue as he has been. He is 89 years old and still lives in their house, and the normal issues of home ownership are weighing on him as well.

Given that it had been a year since I was last in the U.S., I was unaware of how serious his situation was getting until I just recently visited in April. It was during my last visit with him and my mom that I learned more about his health, and this was just a week before I left the U.S. I was so focused on getting ready to leave that the reality of the situation didn't really sink in until after I had returned to Uganda and began settling in here again. Since there is absolutely no one else to help, I need to return to Jacksonville so I can be near him and help as he is less and less able handle his daily affairs and to visit and care for my mother.

I feel a bit like Jacob and that I have wrestled with God over this decision, but I am confident that I have received God's blessing to return and care for my family. I am disappointed and continue to struggle with having to return after serving here less than two years, especially after all it took to prepare to come, but I know that God has begun a good work and he will be faithful to complete it. What I have to do now is to walk the path set before me in faith, and see what God reveals in the future.

My hope and prayer is to be able to return to Uganda at some point in the future, God willing; whether as part of a mission team or even long-term again. During my time here I have learned so much about how the Lord is moving through The Church of Uganda and what some of the needs and opportunities for ministry are here. I pray that God will enable me to continue to tell the stories of what he is doing here and to encourage the building of ministry partnerships with our Uganda brothers and sisters.

I know that I am forever changed because of my time and experiences here. There are things about living in Uganda that make life a struggle at times, and I confess that I do look forward to the luxuries so readily available stateside, but there is so much more here that is so very good and that I regret to leave. Most of all, I will deeply miss the people here. God has brought many dear friends into my life and my heart and we will remain forever connected. I will miss the Uganda smiles.

Please keep me in your prayers as I begin this transition. Once back in Jacksonville I will need to find a job, purchase a car, and reestablish my life there, starting over once again. There is so much to contemplate, but I'm doing my best to put everything in God's hands. He knows all the details! And, he is good, all the time!

On a practical note, may I ask that for the time being that you continue to provide your financial support as I walk through this transition? SAMS will be sending a letter to all of you who have been financial supporters that will further explain the process and needs.

I love you all and so appreciate your prayers and support during this journey.

ENCOURAGING BASEBALL PLAYERS AND COACHES FOR CHRIST

St. Bart's "Night at the Ballpark" on Friday, June 28 At 7 PM

The Niagara Power, named for the Power that is made evident when admiring Niagara Falls, is a team in the New York Collegiate Baseball League (NYCBL) and is an Affiliate of the Fellowship of Christian Athletes (FCA), a national, faith-based ministry. FCA partnered with Cal Kern (Grand Island, NY) and the city of Niagara Falls to establish the Niagara Power in 2007. They play at Sal Maglie Stadium in Niagara Falls.

Skill Development

FCA Baseball offers individual practice sessions in which players are given instruction and time to develop various aspects of their game.

Competition

The Niagara Power plays a forty game schedule that includes competing in the NYCBL, one of the best summer wood bat leagues in the country, as well as other collegiate teams in the U.S.

Character Development

Players have the opportunity to hear from FCA Chaplains, area pastors and sports ministry directors throughout the summer on issues like: "How to Make it to the Next Level" and "The Importance of Living a Life of Character on and off the Field."

Spiritual Development

FCA emphasizes the development of the whole player: body, mind and spirit. The Power conduct regular team bible studies that focus on growing closer to God and how to instill Christian principles into their baseball careers. Power players are also challenged to become positive role models and to share about their faith in Christ throughout the summer through various youth camps, clinics and community service projects.

Being a Team Player for Life

We firmly believe that after a summer with FCA Baseball players will report back to their collegiate programs trained to be better ball players and leaders on their teams, their campuses, and in whatever they do after college.

The Power strongly believes in being active in the community and participating in many service opportunities. We have established our program to be an instrument to give back to our neighborhoods and region.

“My Son”

When someone leaves us I find myself truly amazed to think of all the ways they have touched our lives. As I ponder today, here and now with you— I say with such deep sadness, that I never thought my son would leave us! But I do know that I was blessed to be his dad, my family was blessed, much more fortunate than others for having him with us for the short time we did. And that brings me great pause and some happiness. I feel so humble and thankful to God for giving us.. .Freddy! He was not ours he was a gift from God.

Thank you lord for the privilege of knowing him and having a chance to love him, the time we had with him was truly priceless.

Some have asked me and my wife, how we've been able to cope with his death this well... and I think of a line from the bible... **Joshua 1-9** it's from the time that the lord spoke to Joshua after Moses' death as the Israelites prepared to cross the Jordan River. .. .and The Lord said... **"Have I not commanded you? Be strong and Courageous. Do not be afraid, do not be discouraged for the Lord your God will be with you wherever you go.** And this gives us strength... and perspective... and understanding that keep our minds in a good place. The truth is... that... The Lord is with all of us... all who believe in him... he is with us all the time! I know this in my heart,... I knew it before this tragedy... and I'll know it for every day hereafter... My family and I are unapologetic Christians... we love God and try our best to live by his teachings. My son was a good Christian who had decided as a young boy to bring forth goodness and light rather than evil and darkness into the lives of all he met... We need more men like him.

Looking back from the day he was born till today, (just over 24 years ago.)

For those who don't know —He was born March 29th 1989. I reflect on all that he was exposed to ... good and bad.

I am and will always be one of the proudest fathers ever for all my children.

I get this great sense of pride from all the tough times. Let's face it,... the good times are easier than the hard. The hard times show you what we're capable of. And it's ... during these times, the ones that none of us would want to revisit that I think of how I tried, as best I could, to lead my family forward. Throughout all of it, I relied on my wife, my son and my daughters.

The truth is,... I faltered at times and they were all there,... to pick up the slack. This is where a father gets his pride!

Remembering Fred Garrasi III

Through so much... so many highs and lows, the stuff this life is made up of. These hardships that we've endured, uniquely together as a family...MAKE ME SO PROUD. And because Freddy was the oldest, my son, often times had the most to do, THE HEAVIEST THINGS TO LIFT. He was my big helper, despite all the work that lied before us, I would watch him... his spirit never gave in, he was there to help his dad and his family and he knew there was no one else to do it, so he took care of it. I'd watch as he did even the degrading, menial jobs that no one wants to do, and he did what needed to be done. I know now that these were the times that built his strength of character and work ethic, after helping me,... everything else was easy.

Whether as my best worker, as a boy scout, a student athlete, a police officer or as someone's friend... my son gave of himself. Always trying to do his best and doing what he knew was right. Put another way.. .The darkness; try as it might, could never beat the "white knight" in him, the goodness from within.

He was always a good soul. Throughout his life he had seen much and helped many and always,... there was love..., all around him, from his family and friends certainly from the father who relied on him. He truly made his parents PROUD.. .he served his family, his friends and his community the best he could allowing for him to be known by so many as a good person, a hard worker and a great friend. He was also a great son and brother!

Take heart everyone...We had the chance to say our goodbyes at the hospital we wanted him to know that we were there with him, we wanted him to feel all the love that we had for him and how we wanted God to take care of him.

..if you're wishing you had a chance to speak with him about something before he left us, I can assure you he already knows, a simple prayer is the easiest way to get a hold of him now-....

I stand before you as a father who has given back a son.. given him

Back to God. We will all cherish Freddy and the times that we are all so thankful for, all of the laughs, the special times he gave us.. .and the sacrifices he made to make the people around him better people. I've spoken to him recently and I've asked him to watch over all of us, his friends and his family.

Fred.. ..I know you can see us all here... and you feel the love for you from all these people gathered here. We know you've been promoted to an angel in heaven. And we know they must have needed you there to keep us safe from the forces of evil in this world. All I ask is when we need your guidance can you give us a nudge in the right direction. Or in some cases a poke, a slap in the head or a kick in the pants!

In short,...

Hug your children and cherish the time you have with your family, spend time in God's word because Hebrews 4:12 states The word of God is alive and active and sharper than any two edged sword it penetrates even to dividing soul and spirit, joints and marrow; it judges the thoughts and attitudes of the heart.

The Garrasi family wants to thank all of you for your support and prayers, as time goes on we'll need them both.

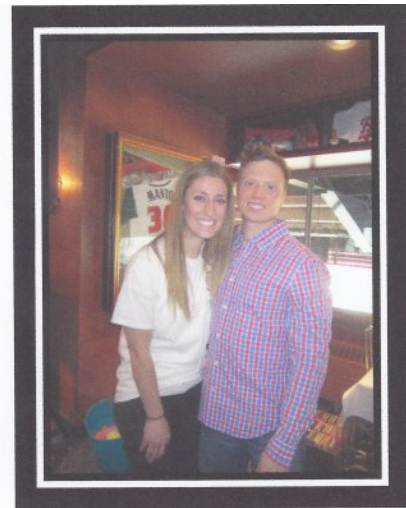

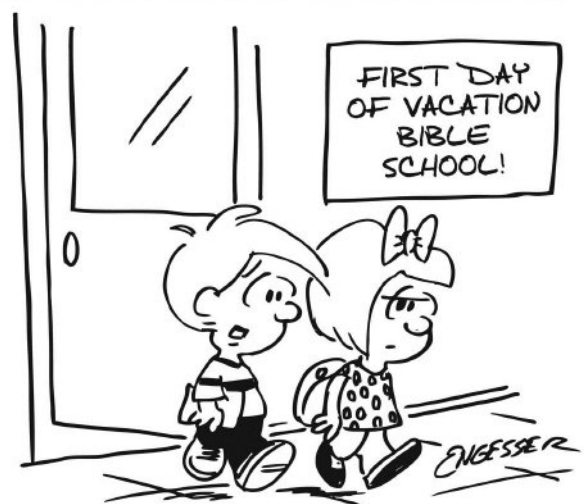
